Biographical Information

Ilona Nanasy worked as the leading designer of public housing for the Hungarian Ministry of Housing from 1978-1991. In 1991, she opened her own architectural practice to design houses for private clients.

Scope and Content

This collection consists of architectural drawings and photographs of projects created by Ilona Nanasy between the years 1978-2003. There are black and white photocopies of plans for competition, residential, and commercial projects, most of which are in Budapest, Hungary. Some photographs show completed projects, while other images are computer generated and may be models of unbuilt projects. Most images are in color. Nanasy's curriculum vitae is also included in the collection. All materials are in Hungarian, and translations of the project names can be found on the reverse side of each project sheet.

Arrangement

The collection is arranged in four folders, one containing her curriculum vitae, the other three holding her competition, residential, and commercial projects. The contents of each folder are arranged chronologically with undated material at the end.
