Biographical/Historical Information

Jack Marshall was a retired cultural anthropologist who lived in Charlottesville since 1988. He was the president of Advocates for Sustainable Albemarle Population, a non-profit organization founded to study population growth (2002-2022). He served as chair of the Rivanna Water and Sewer Authority and the Rivanna Solid Waste Authority (1996-2000) and was President of Citizens for Albemarle, Inc. an organization founded in 1971 to protect the local environment. He was also been member of the Board of Citizens of Albemarle, and other organizations in Charlottesville and Albemarle County. He died February 18, 2026.
