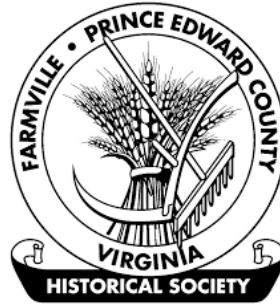

Alice Maud Jones attended State Female Normal School from 1898 to 1901. While a student, she was a founding member of the Zeta Tau Alpha sorority in 1898. Additionally she served on the YWCA Religious Meeting Committee, was Vice President of the Tennis Club, and served as Business Manager of the yearbook. In 1904, she married William Horner of Henderson, North Carolina. Alice Maud Horner passed away in 1920, at the age of 41.
