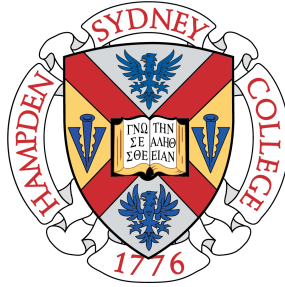

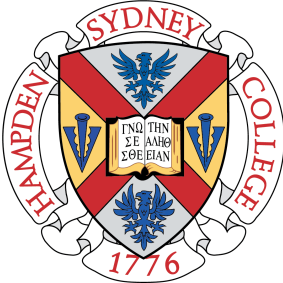

Strong vinegar smell lingering from being stored with deteriorating 8mm film for an unknown amount of time.
