**Biographical / Historical**

Gustavus Brown Wallace Nalle was born in 1846 in Culpepper County, Virginia. He graduated VMI in 1867 and was a New Market cadet. He was also a merchant and farmer. Nalle died in 1926 in Culpepper, Virginia.

**Scope and Contents**

The Nalle Family Civil War letters collection consists of two letters. The first letter (dated January 15, 1865) was written from Philip Pendleton Nalle to his son Cadet G. B. Wallace Nalle. In the letter, Phillip urges G. B. to remain at VMI rather than join the Confederate Army. The second letter (circa 1865) is a fragment from G. B.'s mother, in which she discusses the actions of Union troops in Culpepper County, Virginia, and other Civil War news.
