Biographical / Historical

Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings (1896-1953) was an American writer who lived in rural Florida and wrote novels with rural themes and settings. Her best known work, *The Yearling*—about a boy who adopts an orphaned fawn—won a Pulitzer Prize for Fiction in 1939 and was later made into a movie of the same name.
