**Biographical / Historical**

Augustus Julian Requier (1825-1887) was a Southern poet and lawyer born in South Carolina. In his professional legal work, he served as United States Attorney for the Southern District of Alabama and took the same position under the Confederate government. The poetry he wrote during the Civil War supported the Confederacy. After the war, he lived and worked in New York City.
