Scope and Content

This collection consists of the business, legal, and personal correspondence of the Henkel family of New Market, Virginia, and contains 356 letters (2 Hollinger boxes), 1800-1829, and undated, the majority of which are in German. The correspondents include John Gruber of Hagerstown, Maryland, concerning book purchases and the printing business in New Market; Ambrose Henkel, Golden Spring, Rowan County, North Carolina, and Baltimore, Maryland, where he worked in a bookstore for a time, about family matters, preaching in the Lutheran Church, and book sales; letters from miscellaneous members of the Henkel family; Charles Henkel; Jacob Henkel; Paul Henkel (6 folders of 126 letters); Philip Henkel (5 folders of 110 letters); the business of Samuel & S. Jackson, late David & S. Jackson; Gideon L. Jones; and Samuel Sower & Company.
