To supplement his income while writing the history, he would like to give lecture series on the "life and attitude of the Confederate soldier." His brother, Edward Eggleston, has worked out business details of the lecture series. Asks James B. Pond if he can arrange the lecture series.]

Mentions talks he is giving to the Author's Club.]
