Washington Irving, Paris, France, to noted English publisher John Murray, London, England, concerning the publication of his works *The Sketchbook* and "Arabian tales" which later became either *The Conquest of Granada* (1829) or *Tales of the Alhambra* (1832). He indicates that he has another plan proposed during which he can spend time on original writing, and mentions the new series of the *Curiosities of Literature*.
