Biographical / Historical

George W. Erving was a British born political operative. Erving worked with Samuel Adams. This letter indicates that Erving travelled Virginia to poll Norfolk, Richmond, and Fredericksburg before the election of 1800. In this letter, which was presumably written back to Massachusetts, Erving concluded that the Jeffersonians would win the election.

Content Description

Collection contains a letter written by George W. Erving, after canvassing parts of Virginia for the election of 1800, stating that the Jeffersonians would be the clear winners.
