Harry Flood Byrd, Senior was born in Martinsburg, West Virginia on June 10th, 1887. He was a member of the Virginia Senate from 1916 until 1926, becoming the 50th Governor of Virginia from 1926-1930. Byrd also served as a United States Senator from Virginia from 1933 to 1965, before he died on October 20th, 1966.
